<b>General Specifications</b>
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Gaming supplies purchased by the Manitoba Liquor and Lotteries Corporation (MBLL) or a gaming operator for use in a lottery scheme must meet the Liquor and Gaming Authority of Manitoba (LGA) gaming integrity standards. Quality assurance (QA) inspection testing ensures gaming supplies meet these standards. QA testing is to be conducted and the successful test, design schematic (when applicable) and packing slip are to be submitted in support of the Gaming Integrity Approval Application.

All issues, manufacturing defects or imperfections discovered during the inspection must be documented. MBLL and/or gaming operator must contact the gaming supplier if any issues, concerns or discrepancies arise at any time during the inspection of a shipment or whenever gaming supplies are received that do not meet the applicable standard.

To ensure gaming supplies maintain compliance with the LGA Terms and Conditions, QA testing must be conducted on ALL reorders and shipments received.

A copy of the QA test is to be supplied to the LGA for all subsequent shipments received, upon request.

All gaming supplies that pass QA testing must be marked to identify that they have met the applicable standards. Refer to the definitions provided within the standards.

## Quality Assurance Testing Criteria

Distribution/Packaging	Pass	Fail	N/A
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1. The master shipping case's outer box label matches the purchase order and packing slip.
2. No signs of tampering or damage were detected prior to removing crates from the truck. Crates, wrapping and banding were intact.
3. No signs of tampering or damage were detected after removing crates from the truck.
4. The security tape sealing the box is intact. The box is not crushed in any place. There is no damage to the cards. Any damage or suspected tampering is noted.

### Construction Standards

Randomly selected decks from every shipment must have the following tests conducted. Random selection and quantity is left to the discretion of the gaming operator, testing must be conducted on each deck within a set (plastic poker cards) or each different colour deck (paper cards). All tests must be conducted under incandescent (not fluorescent) light. These tests are not for performance criteria or for compatibility with other gaming supplies.

5. Each carton indicates the purchase order number, colour of the cards it contains, gaming premises and the unique manufacturer identifier/edition number. This information matches the master shipping label.
6. The wrapping and box for each deck show no signs of tampering.
7. For "pre-shuffled decks", the manufacturer has provided confirmation that each deck is complete and the method used.
8. Reordered cards match cards that are currently in inventory.
9. There are no defects, blemishes or imperfections on any of the cards.
10. The cards face and back match approved artwork.
11. The deck is in the correct order (value/pips, suit, joker, barcode and advertising/calendar cards).
12. Pips within the centre row on aces, threes, fives, sixes, sevens, eights and nines; and of the clubs, hearts and spades only; are all pointing in the same direction.
13. When the cards are fanned face-up, they are positioned sequentially by suit (♥, ♣, ♦, ♠ and the kings "kiss"), unless identified differently in the RFP specifications.

If different specifications were provided to the manufacturer, specify order:

14. The edition number (on ace of spades) is consistent with other decks and matches the number on the master shipping case, carton and boxes. Edition Number:

Back Design (top/bottom of "Adjust Shuffler" card):

- 15. The back of the cards reflect light consistently. They are free from daub, crimps or other defects (angle test).
- 16. The back of the cards are consistent in colour (ribbon spread test).
- 17. The size of all cards in the deck is identical. There are no "trims" or "strippers" (size test).
- 18. The design on the back of the cards is identical. There is no inconsistency in the design or "run off". In the event off-centre cut is detected, it is consistent throughout the deck (bevel test)

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19. The amount being recorded into inventory matches the actual amount shipped and accepted for gaming use.

Retain each QA testing checklist along with a copy of the design schematic (if applicable) and the packing slip. The LGA may request the QA testing performed on subsequent shipments.

Each deck of playing cards received in the shipment must have no defects or imperfections. When gaming supplies are received and fail QA testing based upon the standards, or do not adhere to the Gaming Integrity approval, it is the responsibility of the purchaser to have the issues corrected with the gaming supplier. Gaming supplies with defects or imperfections must not be offered for play.
